With deep connections to Noongar culture, early settlement and convict history – alongside antique stores, character pubs and village charm – Guildford Mandoon has long been a unique and special place.

Set on land almost entirely encircled by the Swan and Helena Rivers, this ‘island village’ is perfectly suited to exploration on foot.

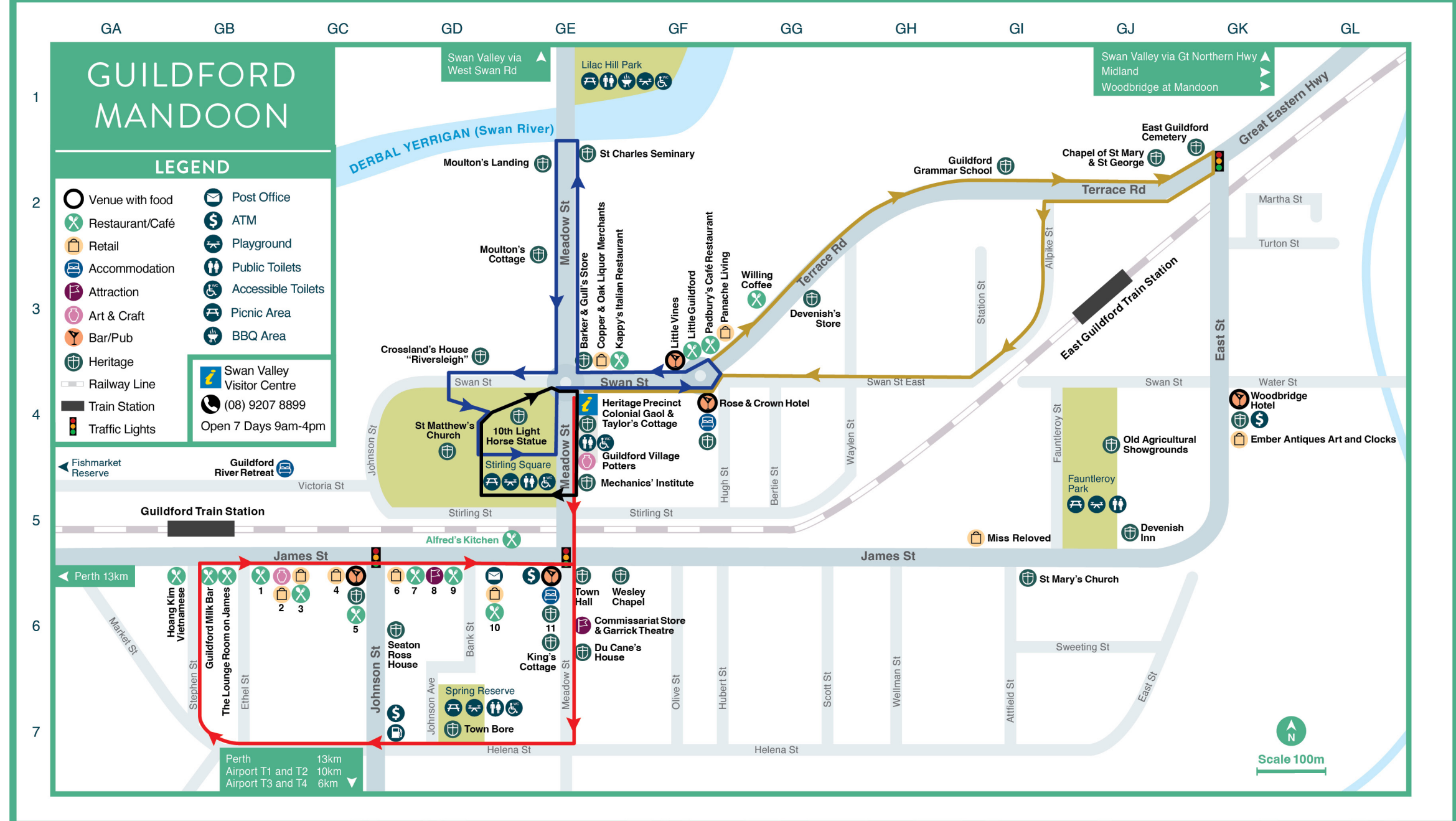
Four self-guided walk trails with 50 interpretive panels reveal a rich Noongar heritage, scenic natural beauty, historic buildings, and layered stories of convict and settlement eras.

Each trail is marked by coloured plates on heritage-green posts with the original town crest, depicting wheat for agriculture, grapes for viticulture, and an anchor for trade – reflecting Guildford Mandoon’s early role as a link between inland farming and the wider world.

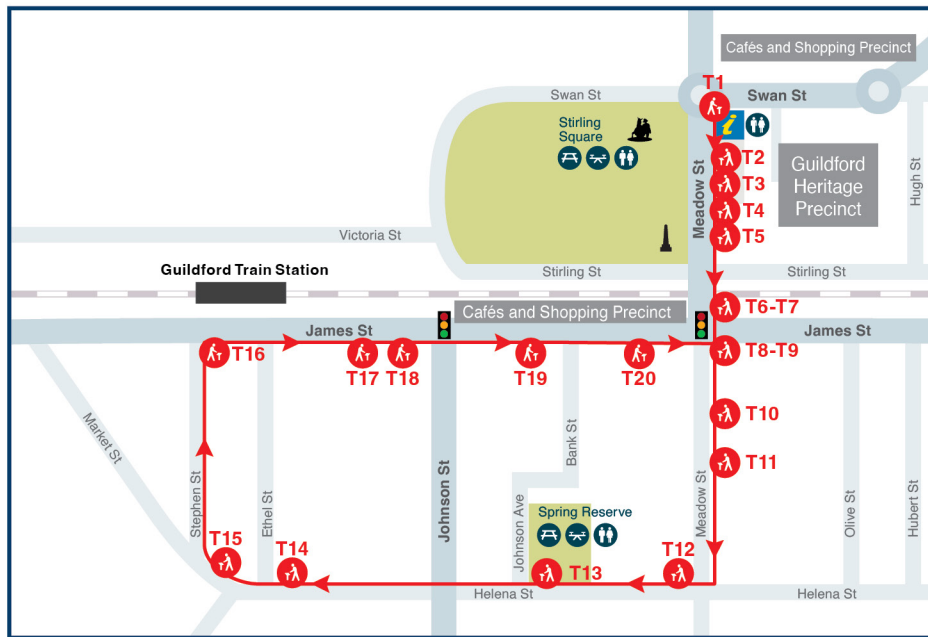


Did you know?

Guildford Mandoon was declared a historic town in 1984 and added to the State Register of Historic Places in 2019, recognising its significance to Western Australia.



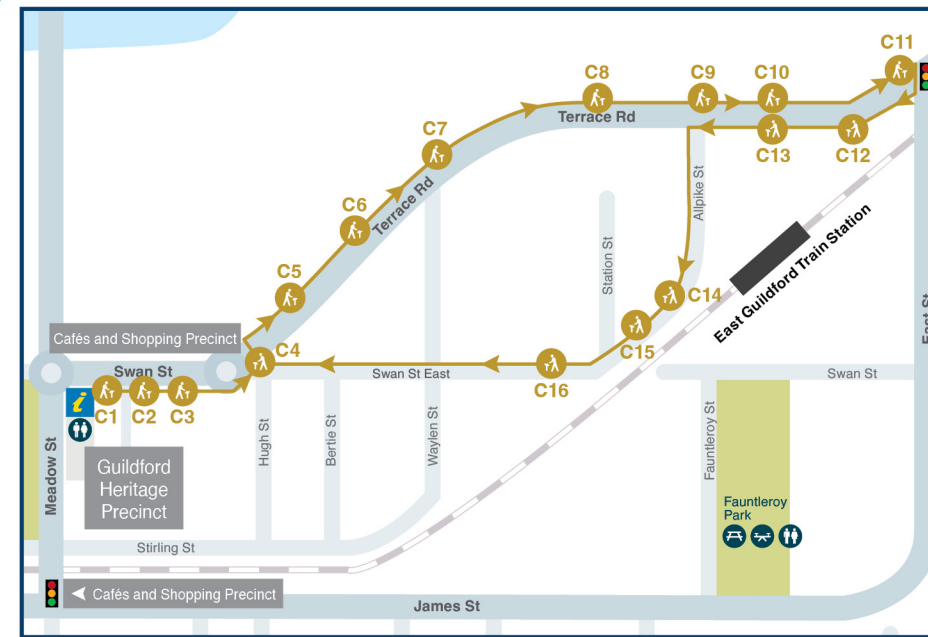

The Town Walk (red markers) 1.8km, 40–60 minutes

This walk features the town's early planning in 1829 in the style of an English village, the Guildford Heritage Precinct, civic buildings, historic hotels and cottages, James Street cafés and homeware shops.

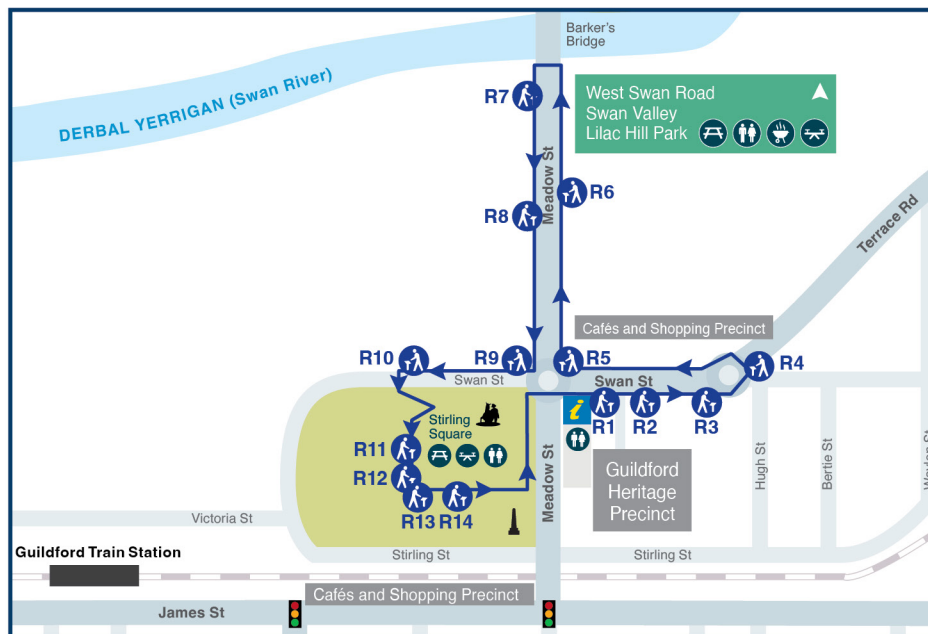

The Captain Stirling Walk (gold markers) 2.25km, 60–75 minutes

This longer walk features the mature plane tree streetscape and picturesque Chapel and grounds of Guildford Grammar School, the Rose and Crown Hotel and Padbury's Store precinct.

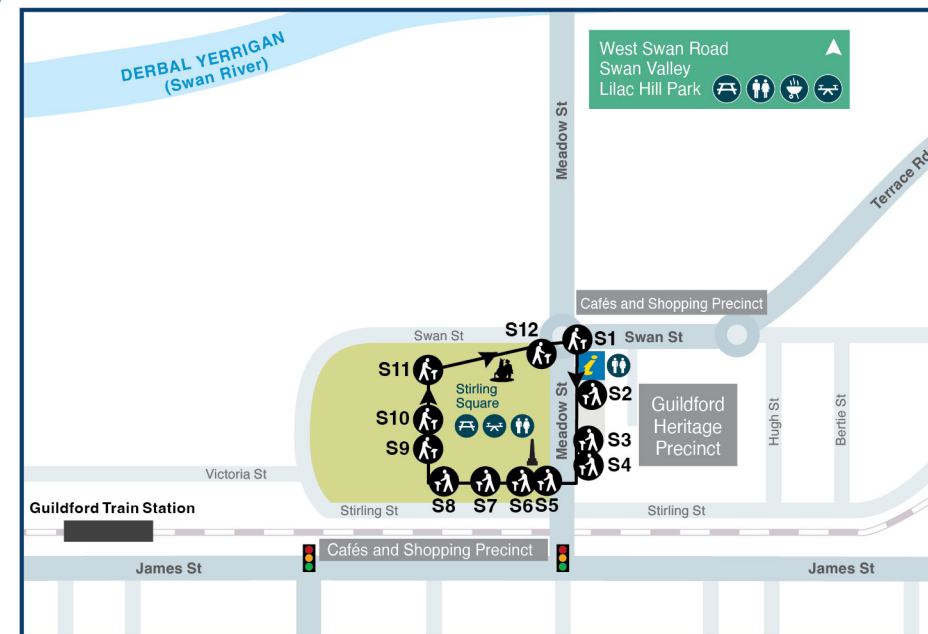
The Chapel of St Mary and St George is within Guildford Grammar School grounds and not open to the public. Exterior photography must not include students.

The River Ramble (blue markers) 1.5km, 30–50 minutes

This trail where warehouses flourished when Guildford was a vital port and market town passes the Rose and Crown Hotel (c.1841), Padbury's Store cafés and shopping precinct, includes the Derbal Yerrigan (Swan River) and picturesque Stirling Square.

The Stirling Square Circuit (black markers) 450 metres, 20 minutes

For those short of time, this walk of the historic Meadow Street precinct and picturesque Stirling Square – a traditional Whadjuk Noongar meeting place – encompasses all that is central to Guildford's civic and spiritual heart.

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Follow to keep up with everything happening in Guildford and the Swan Valley.
