



— SWAN VALLEY — OLD VINE

The Swan Valley Old Vine Charter is the collaboration of people dedicated to the preservation of old vines and the diverse styles of wine crafted from them.

This charter recognises our story through wine, acknowledging the importance of retaining the valuable legacy handed down through the generations.

The Swan Valley is home to the oldest grape vines in Western Australia.

The purpose of the Swan Valley Old Vine Charter is to support the long-term protection of old vines and validate their value in winemaking.

The fruit from old vines can produce wines with great intensity, depth, and vibrancy.

The strength and resilience of old vines reflects the toil of generations of local families, importantly retaining our history in the ground.

The Charter is modelled on the Barossa Old Vine Charter, recognising the age of vines as:

OLD VINE 35+ YEARS	SURVIVOR 70+ YEARS
CENTENARIAN 100+ YEARS	ANCESTOR 125+ YEARS


